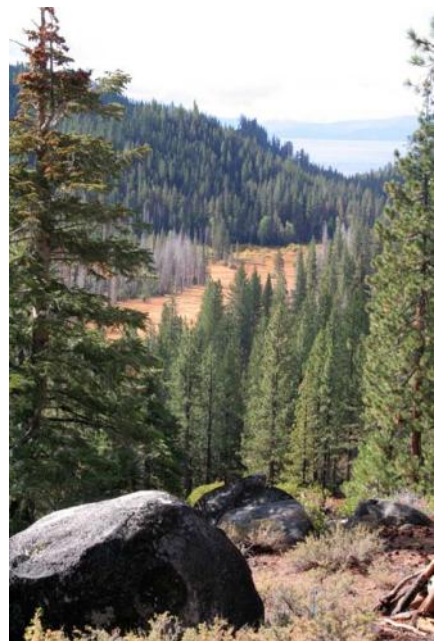


# TRUCKEE RAILROAD MUSEUM

## Trestle Tour

### Carson and Tahoe Lumber and Fluming Company

**June 19th**—Starting in 1861, logs came from all over the Lake Tahoe Basin to be cut at the mills in Glenbrook Nevada. Our Tour will begin near Glenbrook as we follow the first part of the D. L. Bliss legacy. From the Glenbrook parking lot, we will go up the hill to follow old grade to a switchback on a trestle overlooking Lake Tahoe. The line switches back again before heading down Slaughterhouse Canyon to Glenbrook. Next, we will take a short drive to Spooner Meadow and Spooner Summit. This is where the lumber came off the railroad and was put in a V-Flume to float down to Carson City. We will then visit Clear Creek Canyon to see where the 17 mile flume trip went. Finally we end at Carson City near the site of the old lumber yard. After the tour, you might enjoy a trip to the Nevada State Railroad Museum in Carson City.

**Time:** 10:00 am

**Location to meet:** Parking lot and historic marker on highway 50 at the entrance to Glenbrook, Nevada.

**Duration of the Tour:** About 2 hours

**Road conditions:** All paved roads

**Dress:** Changeable weather! In June, the Tahoe area can be 80 degrees and sunny, or cold, stormy and windy. Insect repellent and sunscreen might be handy.

**Hiking:** Easy 3/4 mile hike (optional) along old railroad grade. The rest is easy access from your car.
